From : Department of Fish and Game-Chico Office Subject : Big Chico Creek 2008 Adult Escapement Estimate

Big Chico Creek was snorkel surveyed from Higgins Hole downstream to Ten Mile Gate (Upper Bidwell Park) on August 20th, 2008. Ten Mile Gate to Salmon Hole was surveyed on August 22nd, 2008. The survey was divided in three different sections (Figure 1). California State University, Chico Research Foundation employees Andrew Honeycutt, Andrew Anderson and Bryan Rilea participated in this years' survey.

The 2008 spawning escapement for spring-run Chinook salmon is 0. The total number of salmon observed in each section and water temperature data are provided in the table below.

This year's adult escapement survey was scheduled to be conducted earlier than in years past due to the concern for potential pre-spawn mortalities resulting from low water flow and increasing water temperatures. However, the survey was postponed and rescheduled after air quality issues related to the Butte Fire Complex subsided.

In Sections (1), (2), and (3) no salmon were observed in the entire reach.
