Tuesday May 20 – Lower and Upper Cushman Dams; Mike Garello will lead the tour

- Lower and Upper Cushman Dam, Hoodspport, Washington: Objective: See how Tacoma Power and the Skokomish Tribe resolved the issue of how to lift adult fish collected at the base of a high-head dam to a handling facility. Potential application: lifting juvenile fish collected in Winnemem Waywaket up and into a flume to allow them to flow via gravity to Dry Creek and lifting adults over Shasta Dam. Discuss performance and modifications with Tacoma Power representatives.
- 7:30 a.m. – Gather at the morning rally point (Radisson Hotel, Seattle Airport, 18118 International Boulevard, Seattle, Washington 98188).
- 8:15 a.m. to 8:40 a.m. – Drive to Fauntleroy Ferry Terminal line; introductions while in ferry line. (Note: You must fall into the end of the ferry line which is likely alongside the road **or**, if no line exists, pass through the ticket booth and fall into the lane that they designate.)
- 9:10 a.m. to 9:55 a.m. – Take Fauntleroy to Southwick Ferry—departure time is 9:10 a.m., and they will likely begin loading at 8:55 a.m. or so. Sailing time is approximately 45 minutes; arrive Southwick around 9:55 a.m.
- 9:55 a.m. to 10:45 a.m. – Travel to Alderbrook Resort (10 East Alderbrook Drive, Union, Washington 98592).
- 11:00 a.m. to 12:10 p.m. – Eat Brunch at Alderbrook.
- 12:10 p.m. to 12:50 p.m. – Depart for North Fork Skykomish Salmon Hatchery (101 Dow Creek Drive, Hoodspport, Washington 98548).
- 1:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m. – Meet Andy Ollenburg from Tacoma Power at the hatchery; tour adult collection facility and elevator at the lower dam.
- 3:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. – Drive to Snoqualmie Inn (35228 Snoqualmie Parkway, Snoqualmie, Washington 98065).

- 9:30 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. – Arrive at Cle Elum Dam, meet Pat Monk, Andrew Matala, and Todd Newsome. Tour Cle Elum Dam helix and adult complex with Yakama Nation and U.S. Bureau of Reclamation staff.
- 11:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. – Tour Upper Cle Elum River Sockeye Salmon reintroduction program with Yakama Nation staff.
- 12:30 p.m. to 1:00 p.m. – Travel to Cle Elum, Washington.
- 1:00 p.m. to 1:45 p.m. – Buy portable lunches and travel to Melvin Sampson Coho Salmon facility (191 Klocke Road, Ellensburg, Washington).
- 1:45 p.m. to 2:30 p.m. – Tour Coho Salmon facility.
- 2:30 p.m. to 3:30 p.m. – Travel to Nelson Dam.
- 3:30 p.m. to 4:30 p.m. – Tour Nelson Dam removal and view the nature-like fishway; Lead: Mike Garelo.

Thursday May 22 – Yakima River Fish Passage Facilities and Reintroduction Discussions with Yakama Nation at Prosser Dam; Toby Kock will lead the tour

- Objective: View multiple Yakama Nation facilities and programs; adult Sockeye Salmon can be collected and transported if lower river water temperatures get too high; many aspects of the various Yakima River reintroductions are based out of the Prosser "hub."
- 8:00 a.m. to 9:15 a.m. – Travel to Prosser Dam, stopping briefly at Sunnyside Dam to discuss canal and predation mortality.
- 9:15 a.m. to 9:45 a.m. – At Prosser Dam meet with the Yakama Nation/USGS Smallmouth Bass removal crew who will be sampling in the reach below the dam on May 22.
- 9:45 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. – View Prosser headgates and talk about flow management, water temperature issues, Pacific Lamprey reintroduction, summer/fall Chinook Salmon reintroduction, and avian predation; leads: Toby Kock, Shelley Johnson, Tyler Beals, Melinda Goudy, and Todd Newsome.
- 12:00 p.m. to 1:00 p.m. – Lunch in Prosser.
- 1:00 p.m. to 2:00 p.m. – Travel to Tieton Dam.
- 2:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m. – Discuss future reintroduction plans and fish passage development. Leads: Toby Kock, Mike Garello, and John Ferguson.

USGS conducted a fish behavior study at Tieton/Rimrock in 2024 to collect foundational information to inform fish passage development. That study and preliminary results will also be discussed. The feasibility study was completed in 2015 and identified an adult trap and haul option and two juvenile collector options (fixed and floating).

- 3:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. – Return to lodging at SeaTac via Mount Rainier National Park.
